

## **Contract advertisement: Contract Project Coordinator**

**We are seeking an enterprising, self-directed and strategic-thinking contractor to coordinate the second year of a successful wildlife conservation project in the western sub-region of Southeast Queensland.**

### **About the Lockyer Uplands Catchments Inc.**

Lockyer Uplands Catchments Inc. (LUCI) is a community-based conservation organisation, operating in the Lockyer Valley in South-east Queensland. LUCI is working with the Great Eastern Ranges (GER) and International Fund for Animal Welfare (IFAW) to implement the first in a series of Koala Climate Corridors, the Bunyas to Border (B2B) project, an initiative to enhance a critical koala habitat corridor along the western 'horn' of the Greater Border Ranges.

### About the role

LUCI is seeking to contract an enterprising, self-directed and strategic-thinking individual to coordinate Year 2 of the B2B project. In consultation with the LUCI, GER and IFAW project team, the contractor will be responsible for engaging with partners, landholders and the community throughout the corridor to produce a conservation action plan, continue to bed down projects initiated in Year 1, develop new partnerships and initiate on-ground projects, and seek additional funding and resources to sustain the B2B project. It is expected that a large proportion of the stakeholder engagement will be conducted face-to-face.

The B2B project will offer the right candidate \$60,000 (GST excl) to deliver a set of specified outputs by 30 August 2025.

### Key requirements

The contractor must have an ABN and current certificates of insurance (public liability and professional indemnity). The preferred contractor will have:

- High-level skills in stakeholder engagement and managing collaborations across groups;
- Demonstrated strategic ability applied in a conservation context;
- Knowledge of collaborative conservation action planning processes;
- Solid understanding of threatened species habitat restoration processes;
- A proven track record of managing on-ground conservation project delivery;
- Familiarity with the landscape and ecosystems of the western sub-region of Southeast Queensland;
- Good working knowledge of data management processes and online media formats;
- Experience in writing grant applications and seeking resourcing opportunities; and
- A strong ethic of professional service delivery backed by references and relevant credentials.
