<i>Alyxia ruscifolia</i>	CHAIN FRUIT		
<i>Bridelia leichhardtii</i>	IRONBARK, LEICHHARDTS		
<i>Brachychiton, acerifolius</i>	FLAME TREE		
<i>Bursaria incana</i>	BURSARIA, FROSTY		
<i>Bursaria spinosa</i>	BURSARIA, SWEET		
<i>Carex appressa</i>	SEDGE, TALL		
<i>Casuarina cunninghamiana</i>	SHE OAK, RIVER		Take great care NOT to collect <i>Casuarina glauca</i> (a serious weed introduced into some landcare projects and roadsie plantings) by mistake.

<i>Dysoxylum fraseranum</i>	ROSEWOOD		Ripe when capsule opens to show seeds (or when almost ready to open)
<i>var.australe</i>	VARIETY		Ripe when red
<i>Elaeodendron australe var. integrifolium</i>	OLIVE PLUM, RED FRUITED NARROW-LEAF VARIETY		Ripe when orange
<i>Eremophila debilis</i>	DEVIL'S MARBLES		
<i>Eucalyptus molucanna</i>	BOX, GUM-TOPPED	2. Franke Scrube	
<i>Flindersia xanthoxyla</i>	LONG TOM		
<i>Isotoma axillaris</i>	BLUE ISOTOME		
<i>Neolitsea australiensis</i>	BOLLYGUM, GREY		Fruit 12-20mm
<i>Neolitsea dealbata</i>	BOLLYGUM, GREY		Can be distinguished from green bollygum by hairiness of young stems. Fruit 1cm or less.
<i>Pittosporum angustifolium</i>	GUMBY GUMBY		Ripe when capsule opens
<i>Pittosporum revolutum</i>	PITTOSPORUM, YELLOW		Ripe when capsule opens

<i>Polyscias elegans</i>	CELERYWOOD		squeezed.
<i>Rhodosphaera rhodanthema</i>	YELLOWWOOD, DEEP		Collect & plant while seed is young & fresh
<i>Spartothamnella juncea</i>	BROOM,SQUARE STEMMED		
<i>Syncarpia verecunda</i>	TURPENTINE, RAVENSBOURNE (rare)		Collect woody capsules from last season
